



Black Jack

We have written these rules in order to help you when you play in our casino. Don't hesitate to ask anyone of our gaming staff if you are not sure of anything.

Black Jack is an easy game to learn, can be played with a minimum amount of money and this makes it the most popular casino game in the world.

Black Jack uses cash value chips, which can be bought from the dealer at the table or from the cashier desk.

The player has to place a bet by putting chips inside the box marked on the table before the cards dealing. The dealer will deal the player two cards and one to themselves. Ace count as 1 or 11. Picture cards count as a 10 value. All other cards carry their own numeric value.

Surrender

After you have received your first two cards and you decide that your hand is not strong enough to continue, you may 'surrender' by announcing it to the dealer. He will collect your cards and take the half of your bet. The other half will be returned to you. This option is not available when the card for the dealer is Ace

When the dealer gives you an Ace with a 10-value card in your first two cards, this is called a "Black Jack". Unless the dealer's card is not an Ace or 10-value card, the dealer will pay your bet immediately 3:2 (you win the equal amount and half your bet).

If the dealer has a 10-value card the player will not be paid immediately as there is a possibility the dealer may make also Black Jack at the end of the game. If this happens your bet will neither win nor lose.

Insurance

If the dealer has an Ace the players may make 'insurance' against the possibility of the dealer having a Black Jack hand at the end of the game. Insurance costs up to half your bet and in the event of the dealer having Black Jack will pay out 2:1 (twice the amount).

"Card please!"

The object of the game is to beat the dealer's hand but not pass the value of 21. If you wish to take additional cards you must do so by gesture to the dealer. Announces must be accompanied by gestures.

"Double down"

The player may double his original bet on his first two cards if he thinks he will make a hand stronger than the dealer's hand. The doubling amount can be between the table minimum bet and your initial bet. When doubling-down the player receive ONE card only!

"Split"

If your first two cards are of the same numerical value you may place a second bet (same as your initial bet) and split the two cards into two hands. After splitting you can draw additional cards for each of the two hands.

If you decide to split two Aces you will only receive ONE card on each. Note that Ace and a 10-value card do not make a Black Jack at this stage of the game.

You may double-down your bet after splitting or split again if the cards have the same numerical value up to three times (four separate hands).

"No more cards"

When the players have finished their hands the dealer will draw cards to himself. The dealer, unlike the players, has no decision to make and will take cards when their hand values up to 17 or above. If the dealer hand passes 21, this means that he loses and all players' bets will be paid.

When the dealer has Black Jack then the player's Black Jack does not get paid and all other players' bets will be taken.

Black Jack Plus

The game is played as standard Black Jack game rule with the addition of one optional insurance and three side bets. The side bets give you the possibility to bet on your own cards.

The additional insurance is against the possibility of the dealer having a Black Jack when his first card is a 10-value card and he draws any Ace as his hole card. Pays 11:1.

Side Bets

Super Sevens

This side bet allows players to bet on their own cards that there will be one or more 7-value card.

This side bet pays according to the Payoff Table:



Super Sevens Payoff Table	
Hand	Pays
First card a seven	3-1
First two cards unsuited sevens	50-1
First two cards suited sevens	100-1
First three cards unsuited sevens	500-1
First three cards suited sevens	5000-1

These awards are not cumulative, in other words if you get three sevens you don't get paid for one and two sevens as well.

Black Jack Only

This is a side bet that wins if the player's first two cards are a Black Jack. Pays 15:1.

Lucky Pairs

This is a side bet that wins if the player's first two cards are a pair. Pays 11:1.
